Earl awards pins Guernsey celebrates silver anniversary

GUERNSEY—Twenty five years of operation was cause for celebration recently by employees at Tek Guernsey, complete with a luncheon for all employees, a brief program including a talk by President Earl Wantland, and a variety show.

The silver anniversary ceremony highlighted the local growth of Tektronix from its beginnings in early 1959 to its present position as the largest private employer on the island. The celebration was held April 6 at the Beau Sejour, the local leisure and sports center.

In his talk, Earl recalled the early days of the Guernsey plant when he was a member of the original team which set up the operation. Earl and his family lived on the island for about three years, before moving to Heerenveen to establish Tek Holland as a manufacturing facility. His wife Edna accompanied him to the 25th-year ceremony.

Roydon Falla, a senior member of the local government, also spoke briefly, recognizing Tektronix as one of the pioneer companies in light industry locally, and complimenting the company for its contributions to the Guernsey economy.
