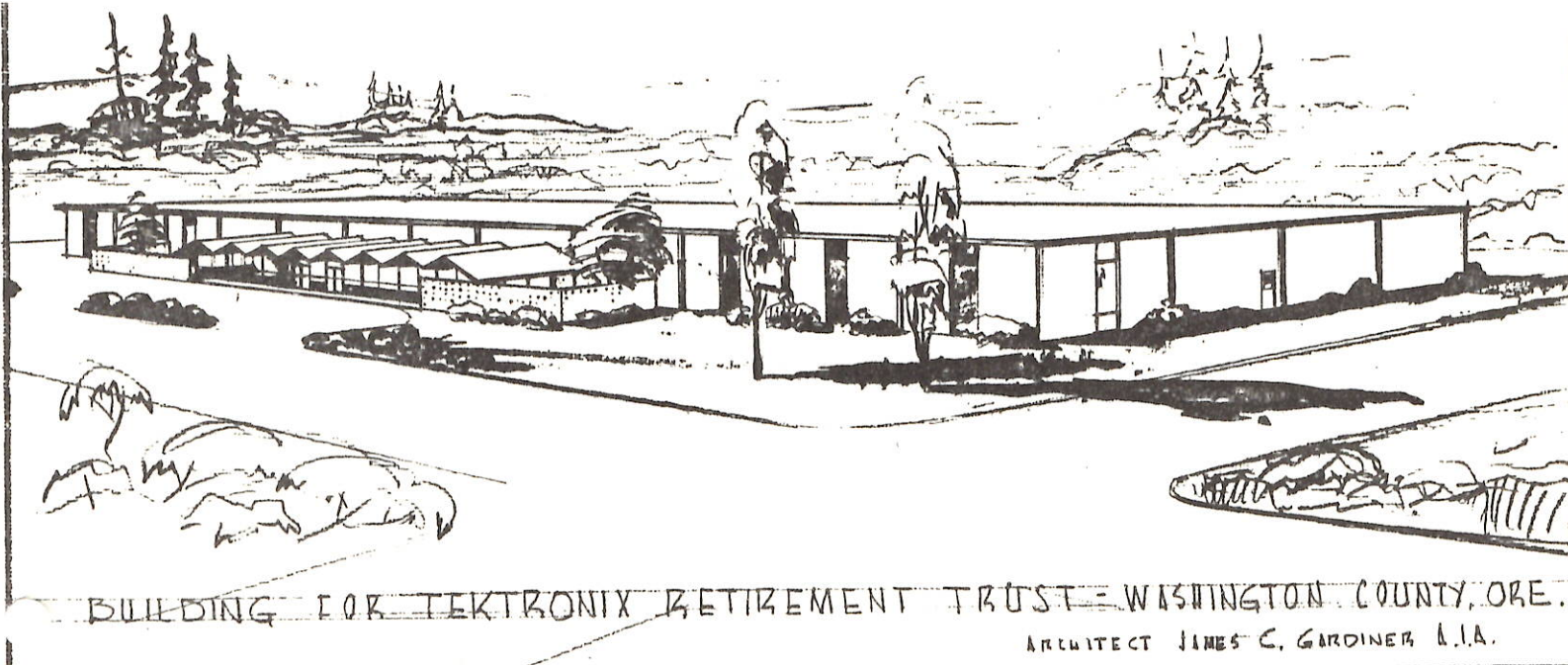

NEWS RELEASE TO VALLEY PAPERS ANNOUNCES CONSTRUCTION START  
PROFIT SHARING RETIREMENT TRUST TO BUILD 32,000 SQ. FT. PLANT



BUILDING FOR TEKTRONIX RETIREMENT TRUST - WASHINGTON COUNTY, ORE.

THE PROFIT SHARING RETIREMENT TRUST OF TEKTRONIX EMPLOYEES, OWNERS OF A 312-ACRE INDUSTRIAL PARK NORTHWEST OF BEAVERTON, ANNOUNCED THIS WEEK THAT CONSTRUCTION HAD BEGUN THERE ON A 32,000-SQUARE FOOT LIGHT MANUFACTURING BUILDING. THE BUILDING WILL BE READY FOR OCCUPANCY NEAR THE 15TH OF AUGUST AND IS BEING BUILT TO BE LEASED.

THE BUILDING IS 32,000-SQ. FT. IN SIZE, WHICH INCLUDES 2,000 SQ. FT. OF OFFICE SPACE. THE STRUCTURE IS A SINGLE-STORY CONCRETE BUILDING USING TILT-UP SLAB CONSTRUCTION. THE ROOF IS FRAMED USING GLUE-LAMINATED WOOD BEAMS, WOOD PURLINS AND WOOD DECKING. THE ENTIRE BUILDING IS TO BE FULLY HEATED AND AIR-CONDITIONED ALONG WITH A COMPLETE AUTOMATIC FIRE SPRINKLER SYSTEM.

ONE NEW FEATURE OF THE OFFICE AREA IS THE FOLDED-PLATE ROOF STRUCTURE WHICH GIVES A SAW TOOTH APPEARANCE. THE PARKING AREA WILL BE LARGE ENOUGH TO ACCOMMODATE APPROXIMATELY 200 CARS.
