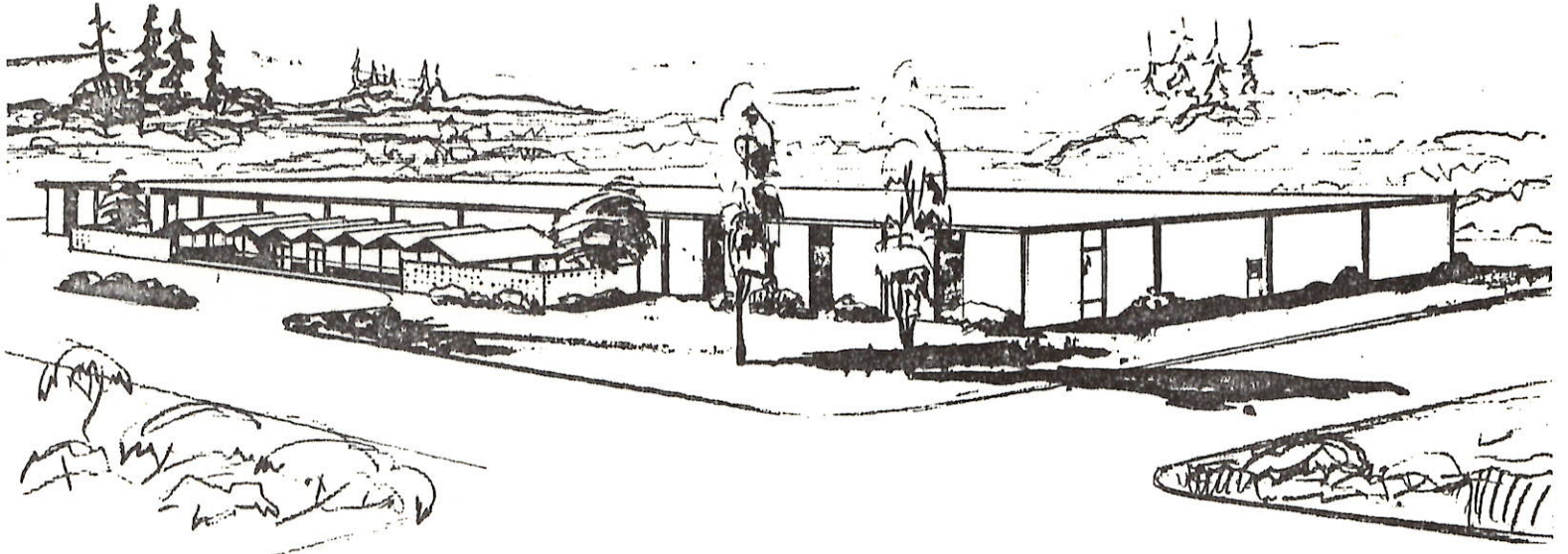

CONTRACTOR W.C. SIVERS COMPANY OF PORTLAND WILL BEGIN CONSTRUCTION TODAY (MONDAY) ON A 32,000-SQUARE-FOOT OFFICE STRUCTURE EAST OF AND SIMILAR TO THE NEW CUSTOMER SERVICE-TRANSFORMERS BUILDING (PICTURED).

WHEN COMPLETED--IT'S HOPED BY JANUARY--THE NEW BUILDING, OWNED BY TEKTRONIX, WILL BE OCCUPIED BY OFFICE FUNCTIONS NOW HOUSED AT OUR SUNSET PLANT AND SOME AT BEAVERTON.

ONE-THIRD OF THE BUILDING WILL BE LEASED AND OCCUPIED BY RODGERS ORGAN COMPANY OF WEST SLOPE. THIS FIRM, COMPOSED LARGELY OF EX-TEK EMPLOYEES, MANUFACTURES THE WORLD'S ONLY TRANSISTOR ORGAN OF ITS SIZE.

THE STRUCTURE, DESIGNED BY ARCHITECT JOHN C. GARDINER OF WEST SLOPE, WILL BE USED BY TEK AS AN INTERIM OFFICE BUILDING. IT WILL DELAY, BUT NOT REPLACE, CONSTRUCTION OF OUR PERMANENT OFFICE BUILDING, TO BE LOCATED ADJOINING THE BEAVERTON PLANT.

WHEN THE PERMANENT QUARTERS ARE COMPLETED, THE STRUCTURE NOW BEING STARTED MIGHT BE USED FOR RODGERS ORGAN EXPANSION OR BY TEKTRONIX COMPONENT PRODUCTION GROUPS.
