

Tek Holland employees mark 20th anniversary



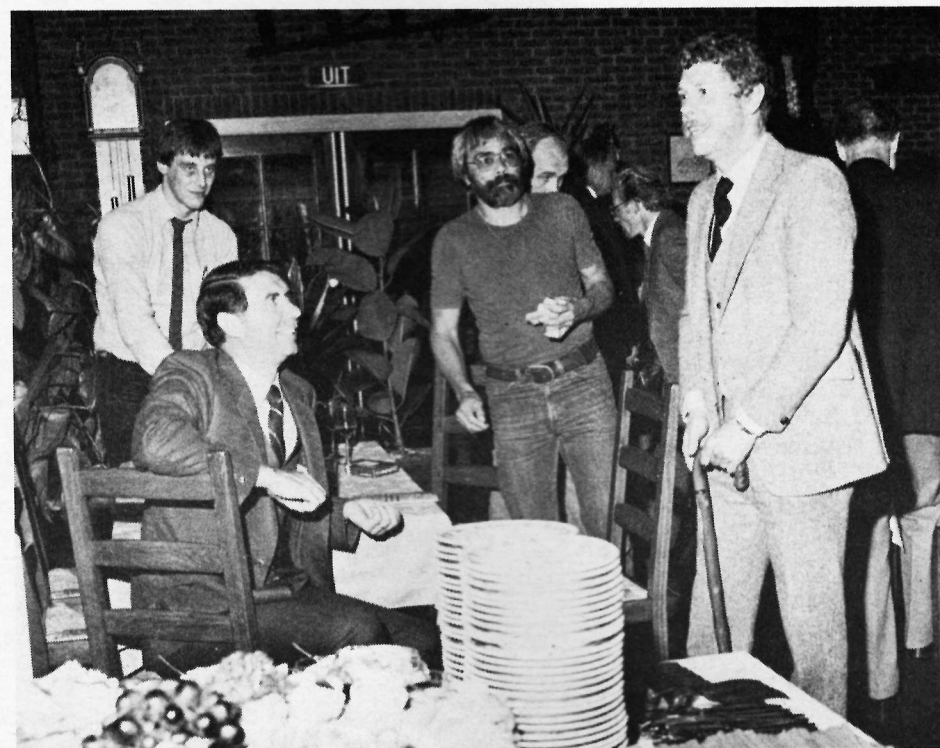
