Major structure planned for Walker Road site

Phase III will get under way in early March, 1978 with completion in March, 1979.

Construction of a two-level major building at Tek's Walker Road site will get under way in early March.

Derald Thornton (Building Superintendent) said the 210,000 square foot multipurpose structure will be located west of the present building. The project is known as Phase III, and estimated cost of the building, parking lots, landscaping and roads is \$11 million.

When completed in March 1979, the building will house Tek's Communications division, according to present plans. A feature of the exterior will be a sunken landscaped courtyard.

Two other construction projects at Walker Road are now under way—a 67,000 square foot addition to the existing building, and a cafeteria.

The addition, at the east side of the building, will be ready for occupancy by February, 1978. Estimated cost is \$2.6 million. Concrete footings were poured last week, and pouring of the concrete floor slab got under way this week.

The cafeteria, a separate building, will be located at the southwest corner of the present Walker Road building, midway between the building and the proposed Phase III. Plans call for completion by early next summer.
