



The large hall pictured above was used for a reception in honor of the opening of a new wing of the Tek Holland manufacturing building. The new area adds 40,000 square feet of manufacturing space which brings the total space available to 100,000 square feet.

The ceremony was attended by a number of dignitaries including the Queen's Commissioner to the province of Friesland and the US Consul-General. The affair was also attended by all the Tek Holland employees.

Ceremonies conducted on January 16 to open new wing at Tektronix Holland

The Queen's Commissioner in Friesland, Mr. Linthorst Homan, opened a new wing of the Tek Holland building January 16.

The wing increases the manufacturing space available by 40,000 square feet which brings the total to 100,000 square feet. The new extension will be used for housing the assembly operations.

Dominating the ceremonies in the new hall was a huge (10 foot tall) scale model of the new-generation 7504 oscilloscope.

Guests attending in addition to the provincial governor were the present burgemeester Mr. Hellinga and his wife, the two retired Burgemeesters Huisman and Kuperus, the American Consul-General Mr. Harold Howland, the Chairman of the

Board of Directors Mr. J. C. S. Waredorf, the architects and representatives of the contractors.

All employees attended the ceremonies, which featured a talk by the Queen's Commissioner on the theme of a new generation of oscilloscopes being built in the new addition by a new generation of Friesians.

The American Consul-General added a historical note by recalling the ties between the province of Friesland and the US, noting that it was the province of Friesland that first recognized the government of the then 13 colonies in 1776.

This recognition encouraged the Dutch bankers to make the first loan to this underdeveloped and founding government.
