And Leave the Driving to Us

If you saw two Greyhound-type buses in the parking lot of Bldg. 63 recently and thought Tek had a new product line, look again. They are the IDD Display cruisers. They house a highly professional product display that tours the U.S. to increase client contact and product exposure. IDD owns the only two display cruisers currently in use by Tektronix. By using two cruisers, the entire U.S. can be reached in nine months. The cruisers can show products to up to 300 people a day.

The Field Offices set up a tour schedule for each cruiser. The tour usually includes Field Offices, major account customers and some university campuses. The cruiser driver meets with a local Sales Engineer the day before each show to decide which products are of greatest interest to those accounts being visited that day. At 9 a.m. the cruiser is ready for visitors. The driver introduces people to the products and gets them moving through the cruiser. A Sales Engineer and a Systems Analyst are usually on hand to answer specific product questions and demonstrate the equipment. The show lasts a half an hour and product literature is available for visitors to take as they leave the cruiser. The product display is usually a fixed group of products although it can be changed to meet specific customer interests or to demonstrate a newly-released product.

The driver is usually a new Sales Engineer who would like an opportunity to further develop presentation skills and become more experienced in talking about and demonstrating a wide range of products. He is primarily responsible for the safety of the cruiser and for maintaining the equipment on board. In addition, he must present a positive image for Tektronix, manage the large numbers of visitors to the cruiser and handle all of the paperwork required for the long inter-state tour.

The IDD cruisers have been enthusiastically received by our customers and other interested people. They promote a strong and positive image for Tek and assist the Field Offices in broadening customer contacts which can lead to increased sales for IDD. BITS AND BYTES

Air Mail Available

A direct air expedite shipping procedure is now available to ship some materials directly from the Wilsonville site.

IDD Receiving and Distribution in conjunction with Corporate Traffic and Shipping have established the following restrictions, guidelines and procedures for this service:

RESTRICTIONS

Important: This new service is restricted to shipments of such an urgent nature that they must move via an "AIR EXPEDITE" mode of Transportation. Shipments of a routine nature will continue to flow through the Distribution Center in Building 73.

- Weight limit of 50 pounds.
- Shipment must not exceed 108 inches in overall dimension.
- Restricted to shipments that move under the "Shipping Memo" P/N 000-1760-00 or "Debit Memo" P/N 000-1192-00 procedure only.

GUIDELINES:

- Shipments will be picked up by the carrier at the IDD Distribution Warehouse building 83, Delivery Station 83-322.
- Materials received in 83-322 by 2:15 p.m. will be shipped the same day.

- Materials received after 2:15 p.m. will be shipped the following day.
- Materials that must ship same day but are not available prior to the 2:15 deadline must be hand delivered to the distribution center, Delivery Station 73-255 and arrive no later than 3:30 p.m.

PROCEDURES

- Prepare the shipping document, i.e., Shipping Memo or Debit Memo.
- Package the materials and insert the Packing List copy of the shipping document. **NOTE:** If you do not have access to packaging materials, Distribution personnel in building 83 will assist you.
- Place the completed shipping document in a shipping memo envelope P/N 000-1365-00. Address it to "83-322 Shipping" and print in bold letters on the left side of the envelope "AIR EXPEDITE."
- Hand carry the shipment to your dock or call the dock to have it picked up. Dock extensions are:
63 dock: X3471
61 dock: X2471
60 dock: X2758

Remember it must arrive at 83-322 by 2:15 p.m. to assure same day shipment.

Software tools is a portable operating system and set of utilities that provides a functional environment similar to UNEX. The conference was jointly held by USENIX/USER/GROUP and Software Tool User Group.
